In 2008, Phymean Noun was honored with a CNN Top 10 Heroes Award and in 2015 she was commended by the World's Children's Prize and named Child Rights Hero of the year for her struggle for the children who scavenge garbage dumps in Cambodia. The same year, Her Excellency, Hun Bun Rany, the President of the Cambodian Red Cross awarded Phymean the Cambodian Medal of Honor.

SPONSORSHIP FAQ

CAN I VISIT MY SPONSORED CHILD?

You are welcome to do so, but are required to give PIO notice before doing so. All visits will be supervised by a senior member of staff.

WHAT UPDATES WILL I RECEIVE FOR THE CHILD I AM SPONSORING?

We can supply you with updates on their academic progress and general well-being. In addition you may write to your sponsored child and they will reply telling you about what they are doing and how they are getting on at school.

WHAT HAPPENS WHEN A SPONSORED CHILD LEAVES PIO? IF I STOP SPONSORING A CHILD WILL THEY STILL BE HELPED BY PIO?

Most children stay at PIO for several years. However they can leave at any time and there are a number of reasons for that. Family circumstances may have improved and they can return to their immediate or extended family, or they may have reached the end of their schooling and want to join the workforce. If the child you are sponsoring leaves PIO then you will be notified and asked if you wish to sponsor a different child.

Yes, we do not differentiate between children that have a sponsor and those that do not. If you are unable to continue your sponsorship the child remains with PIO and we will endeavour to find a new sponsor for them.
